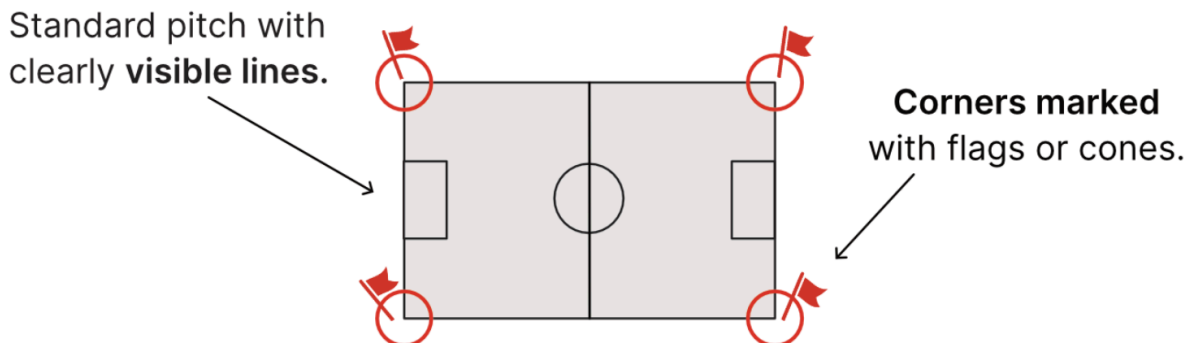





SET UP FOR RECORDING: VEO CAM 3

REQUIRED CONDITIONS

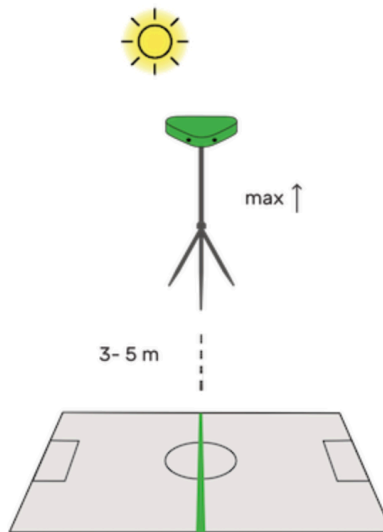


-  Daylight and/or evenly well-lit environment.
-  The camera is secure and stable.
-  Minimal activity around the pitch (avoid other balls/players).

CHECK BEFORE RECORDING

- The camera has enough charge. We recommend charging for at least 4 hours before recording.
- You have installed the Veo Camera app on your device. Click [here](#) to get the iOS app or [here](#) to get the Android app.
- The Veo Cam has free storage space. You can check this on the camera settings page of the app.
- The lenses are clean and free of dust, fingerprints, and/or smudges.

SET UP AND RECORD



1. Avoid lights **directly pointing** into the lenses. Make sure the sun or lights are behind the camera when setting up.
2. Place the tripod **3-5 meters** from the sideline, aligned with the **centerline**.
3. Attach the Veo Cam to the tripod. To make sure your Veo Cam 3 is securely tight and to avoid shakiness when recording, especially during windy days, we recommend tightening the grip, by pushing in on the small handle after you have



mounted the camera.

4. Turn the camera on and raise the tripod to the **maximum** height.
5. Connect to the camera and make sure **all four corners are visible**.
6. If needed, adjust the tripod for **better alignment** with the centerline.

7. Press the record button and let the Veo Cam do the rest of the work. Enjoy your game!
8. Always remember to **stop the recording** once your match is over.

If you're planning to record multiple games at a tournament, for example, avoid recording more than one game on a single recording. We strongly suggest you hit the stop button after each game and start a new recording for every new game. Keep in mind recordings can't be trimmed in the platform.

This is especially important since the system might reject recordings longer than 8 hours due to their size. Having more than one game in a recording can also impact the accuracy of AI features, like automatic highlights and Veo Analytics, and lastly, it makes it difficult to assign recordings to the correct teams.

Important note: Start your recording **only after** the camera has been placed in the correct position (tripod at the maximum height and aligned with the centerline). Starting a recording and then changing the camera's position can cause the AI to have difficulty selecting corners and following the ball, resulting in bad-quality videos.
