## TODAY'S GAME

The U.S. Men's National Team takes on Great Britain today in its second preliminary round game of the 2026 IIHF Men's World Championship. Opening faceoff is set for 12:20 p.m. All U.S. games in the world championship will air live on NHL Network in the U.S.

## THE SERIES VS. GREAT BRITAIN

The U.S. and Great Britain meet for the 7th time in the IIHF Men's World Championship today. The U.S. is 4-0-0-0-2 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) against Great Britain all-time. The teams last met in the 2022 IIHF Men's World Championship with Team USA earning a 3-0 victory.

## THINGS

The U.S. is the visiting team today, will wear its white jerseys, and occupy the right bench ... Team USA's lineup has two changes today with defenseman **Declan Carlile** replacing **Wyatt Kaiser** and goaltender **Drew Comness** dressing in place of **Joseph Woll** ... Team USA did not practice yesterday, but did have an early afternoon team stretch at the hotel ... U.S. assistant coaches **Kevin Dean** and **Darby Hendrickson** played together on the 1998 U.S. Men's National Team at the world championship in Zurich and Basel, Switzerland. Dean was a defenseman, while Hendrickson played forward for coach Jeff Jackson ... The U.S. made one roster move yesterday, releasing forward **Ryker Lee**. Forward **Matthew Tkachuk** will be arriving in Zurich on May 19 ... **Justin Faulk** has played in 15 NHL seasons, the most of any player on Team USA. Faulk has competed in more than 1,000 NHL regular-season games. **Matthew Tkachuk** is next with 10 NHL seasons, while **Connor Clifton** and **Ryan Lindgren** have both played in eight NHL campaigns ... **Justin Faulk** played 22:55 against Switzerland, the most of any U.S. player with **Mason Lohrei** second at 21:55. **Ryan Leonard** logged 17:12, the most of any U.S. forward

## FREE BIRD

The U.S. goal song is Free Bird by Lynyrd Skynyrd. The song was first used by the 2025 U.S. National Junior Team and caught fire as the U.S. won gold. It caught further fire when used by the U.S. at February's 4 Nations Face-Off, including a call from the band's manager celebrating its use. It is today used by all U.S. national teams.

## IN SWITZERLAND

There have been 10 previous IIHF Men's World Championships conducted in Switzerland and the U.S. has participated in six of those. Team USA's best-ever finish in the event in Switzerland was in 1939 when it earned a silver medal in Basel and Zurich. The last world championship to be staged in Switzerland was in 2009 when Team USA finished fourth. John Michael-Liles (1-8--9) and Dustin Brown (3-5--8) were the top two U.S. point getters while Robert Esche (3-0-2-3, 3.12, .891) was the team's top netminder.

## VISIT FROM THE AMBASSADOR

Callista Gingrich, the U.S. Ambassador to Switzerland, was at last night's USA-Switzerland contest and presented the U.S. Player of the Game award to captain Justin Faulk following the contest on the ice. In addition, Ambassador Gingrich and her husband Newt Gingrich, the former U.S. Speaker of the House, visited Team USA's lockerroom after the game. Callista welcomed the group to Switzerland and shared how terrific it was to have the players in the country representing the United States. Newt also said a few words and applauded the competitive play of Team USA, something he said Tom Emmer (U.S. House Majority Whip from Minnesota), who is a big hockey fan, would appreciate. Faulk presented the Ambassador with a signed wimpel (similar to a pennant) and thanked her and her husband for coming to support Team USA.



## LEADERSHIP

**Justin Faulk** from the Detroit Red Wings is the captain of Team USA. The 2014 Olympian and 15-year NHL vet has played in three previous IIHF Men's World Championships (2012, 2013, 2015), helping the U.S. to bronze medals in 2015 and 2013. **Ryan Lindgren** and **Mathieu Olivier**, both who are making their IIHF Men's World Championship debut, are the team's alternate captains.

## HOSTING 2027 IIHF U18 MEN'S WORLDS

The U.S. will host the IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship in 2027 and the dates and location are expected to be announced soon.

### TEAM USA'S ALL-TIME MEN'S WORLDS MEDALS

The U.S. has won 14 medals in the men's world championship, earning gold twice (2025, 1933), silver four times (1950, 1939, 1934, 1931) and bronze on eight occasions (2021, 2018, 2015, 2013, 2004, 1996, 1952, 1949). Of Team USA's eight bronze medals, six were claimed by winning bronze-medal games while two came via tournament standings and round-robin play.

### NTDP IMPACT

A total of 12 players on the U.S. Men's National Team roster played full-time at USA Hockey's highly acclaimed National Team Development Program in Plymouth, Mich. (greater Detroit). The group includes goaltenders **Joseph Woll** and **Drew Comness**; defensemen **Justin Faulk**, **Ryan Lindgren** and **Connor Clifton**; and forwards **Isaac Howard**, **Ryan Leonard**, **Oliver Moore**, **Danny Nelson**, **Matthew Tkachuk**, **James Hagens**, and **Max Plante**. In addition, **Tommy Novak** played four games at the NTDP in 2013-14.

### NOTES FROM PREVIOUS VERSIONS OF GAME NOTES

The U.S. became the first nation ever to earn gold in both men's and women's hockey in the Olympics and sled hockey in the Paralympics in the same year ... **John Vanbiesbrouck**, who is assistant executive director of USA Hockey and part of the management group for the 2026 U.S. Men's National Team, played 882 regular-season games in his 20-year NHL career, the most of any American in history ... **Don Granato** is the head coach of Team USA in the world championship for the first time ... **Darby Hendrickson** is leading the U.S. power play with assistance from **Brandon Naurato**, while **Kevin Dean** is in charge of the U.S. penalty kill with help from **Ty Hennes** ... A total of seven players part of Team USA have previously played in the IIHF Men's World Championship, with Justin Faulk the most experienced (see chart later in these notes) ... Three players -- **Ryan Leonard**, **Oliver Moore** and **Danny Nelson** -- helped the U.S. earn gold here in Switzerland at the 2023 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship in Basel and Porrentruy ... The U.S. played its first game on May 15, the second latest ever for Team USA. The latest opening game for the U.S. in the world championship was May 22, 2021, in Riga, Latvia, when Team USA dropped a 2-1 decision to Finland. Team USA went on to earn bronze in that tournament.

**Last BMG:** L, 3-4 OT vs. Latvia (2023)  
 The U.S. is 6-6 in 12 previous bronze-medal games in the IIHF Men's World Championship. The eight bronze medals the U.S. has won include those determined by standings and also by a single bronze medal game.
