**LITTLE LEAGUE CONSTITUTION**

**ARTICLE I - NAME**

This organization shall be known as the LAKESIDE Little League, hereinafter referred to as "Local League" or "Lakeside".

**ARTICLE II - OBJECTIVE**

**SECTION 1**

The objective of the Local League shall be to implant firmly in the children of the community the ideals of good sportsmanship, honesty, loyalty, courage and respect for authority, so that they may be well adjusted, stronger and happier children and will grow to be good, decent, healthy and trustworthy citizens.

**SECTION 2**

To achieve this objective, the Local League will provide a supervised program under the Rules and Regulations of Little League Baseball, Incorporated. All Directors, Officers and Members shall bear in mind that the attainment of exceptional athletic skill or the winning of games is secondary, and the molding of future citizens is of prime importance. In accordance with Section 501-(c)-(3) of the Federal Internal Revenue Code, the Local League shall operate exclusively as a non-profit educational organization providing a supervised program of competitive baseball and softball games. No part of the net earnings shall inure to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual; no substantial part of the activities of which is carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and which does not participate in or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

**ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP**

**SECTION 1**

**Eligibility.** Any person sincerely interested in active participation to further the objective of this Local League may apply to become a Member.

**SECTION 2**

**Classes.** There shall be the following classes of Members:

(a) **Player Members.** Any player candidate meeting the requirements of Little League Regulation IV shall be eligible to compete for participation. Player Members shall have no rights, duties or obligations in the management or in the property of the Local League.

(b) **Regular Members.** Regular members are Officers of the Board and other elected or appointed official active members in good standing. This also includes Managers, Coaches, and Team Parents. This also includes any other volunteer who submits a volunteer application through the Local League's website.

(c) **General Members.** A General Member is a person who is neither a Player Member or Regular Member as defined above. General Members shall have no voting rights for any Local League matters or issues or at the Annual Meeting. They may attend the Annual Meeting and all open portions of Board of Directors meetings.

(d) As used hereinafter, the word "Member" shall mean a Regular Member unless otherwise stated.

### SECTION 3

#### **Other Affiliations.**

- (a) Members, whether Regular or Player, shall not be required to be affiliated with another organization or group to qualify as members of the Local League.
- (b) Regular Members should not be actively engaged in the promotion and/or operation of any other baseball/softball program when acting in the capacity of a Regular Member.
- (c) Any Member shall not use contact information received through Little League business to promote, recruit, solicit, and/or operate another program outside of Little League.

### SECTION 4

Suspension or Termination. Membership may be terminated by resignation or action of the Board of Directors as follows.

- (a) The Board of Directors, by a two-thirds vote of those present at any duly constituted Board meeting, shall have the authority to discipline or suspend or terminate the membership of any Member of any class, including managers and coaches, when the conduct of such person is considered detrimental to the best interests of the Local League and/or Little League Baseball, Incorporated. The Member involved shall be notified of such meeting, informed of the general nature of the charges and given an opportunity to appear at the meeting to answer such charges.
- (b) The Board of Directors shall, in case of a Player Member, give notice to the manager of the team for which the player is a Player Member. Said manager shall appear, in the capacity of an adviser, with the player before the Board of Directors or a duly appointed committee of the Board of Directors. The player's parent(s) or legal guardian(s) may also be present. The Board of Directors shall have full power to suspend or revoke such player's right to future participation by two-thirds vote of those present at any duly constituted meeting (quorum is required).

## ARTICLE IV - DUES FOR REGULAR MEMBERS (NOT PLAYERS)

### SECTION 1

Dues for Regular Members may be fixed at such amounts as the Board of Directors shall determine for a particular fiscal year. (See Article XI, Section 7 for fiscal year of this league.) Note: Dues for Regular Members are separate from registration fees for Player Members, which are determined annually by the Board of Directors.

## ARTICLE V - GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS

### SECTION 1

**Definition.** A General Membership Meeting is any meeting of the membership of the league (including Special General Membership Meetings, Section 7). A minimum of one per year (Annual Meeting, see Section 6) is required.

### SECTION 2

**Notice of Meeting.** Notice of each General Membership Meeting shall be delivered personally, electronically or by mail to each Member at the last recorded address at least (choose one) ... seven (7) days in advance of the meeting, setting forth the place, time and purpose of the meeting. In lieu of the above methods, notice may be given in such form as may be authorized by the Members, from time to time, at a regularly convened General Membership Meeting.

### SECTION 3

**Quorum.** At any General Membership Meeting, the presence in person or representation by absentee ballot of one fifth (20 percent) of the members (as defined in Article III - Membership) shall be necessary to constitute a quorum. If a quorum is not present, no business shall be conducted.

### SECTION 4

**Voting.** Only Regular Members shall be entitled to make motions and vote at General Membership Meetings. However, the Board of Directors may invite, admit and recognize guests for presentations or comments during General Membership Meetings. (Those eligible to take part at meetings of the Board of Directors are described in Article VI, Section 4.).

### SECTION 5

**Absentee Ballot.** For the expressed purpose of accommodating a Regular Member in good standing who cannot be in attendance at the Annual Meeting, or any General Membership Meeting at which new Board members will be elected, an absentee ballot may be requested and obtained from the Secretary of the League. The absentee ballot shall be properly completed, signed and returned in a sealed envelope to the Secretary prior to the date of the election. The Secretary shall present all absentee ballots to the Election Chairman (appointed at the meeting) on the date of the meeting, prior to the voting portion of the election process.

### SECTION 6

**Annual Meeting of the Members.** The Annual Meeting of the Members of the Local League shall be held prior to the Local League's June Board Meeting, which will be held on the second Tuesday of June at 8:00 p.m. at Granite Bay Library. (Insert date/time; For example: "the third Wednesday of (month) at 8 p.m.") each year for the purpose of electing new Members, electing the Board of Directors, receiving reports, reviewing the Constitution, appointing committees, and for the transaction of such business as may properly come before the meeting.

(a) The Membership shall receive at the Annual Meeting of the Members of the Local League a report, verified by the President and Treasurer, or by a majority of the Directors, showing:

- (1) The condition of the Local League, to be presented by the President or his/her designate;
- (2) A general summary of funds received and expended by the local league for the previous year, the amount of funds currently in possession of the local league, and the name of the financial institution in which such funds are maintained;
- (3) The whole amount of real and personal property owned by the Local League, where located, and where and how invested;
- (4) For the year immediately preceding, the amount and nature of the property acquired, with the date of the report and the manner of the acquisition, the amount applied, appropriated or expended, and the purposes, objects or persons to or for which such applications, appropriations or expenditures have been made;
- (5) The names of the persons who have been admitted to regular membership in the Local League during such year. This report shall be filed with the records of the Local League and entered in the minutes of the proceedings of the Annual Meeting. A copy of such report shall be forwarded to Little League International.

(b) At the Annual Meeting, the Members shall determine the number of Directors to be elected for the ensuing year and shall elect such number of Directors. The number of Directors elected shall be not less than seven (7).

(b) After the Board of Directors is elected, the Board shall meet to elect the officers. The Executive Committee (as defined in Article VIII) may meet prior to Board to recommend a slate of officers. After the election, the Board of Directors shall assume the performance of its duties on September 1. The Board's term of office shall continue until its successors are elected and qualified under this section.

(c) The Officers of the Board of Directors shall include, at a minimum, the President, one or more Vice Presidents, Treasurer, Secretary, one or more Player Agents, a Safety Officer and a Coaching Coordinator. The Board shall also include a minimum of one manager and one volunteer umpire. Only volunteer umpires may be elected to the Board.

#### SECTION 7

**Special General Membership Meetings.** Special General Membership Meetings of the Members may be called by the Board of Directors or by the Secretary or President at their discretion. Upon the written request of twenty (20) Members, the President or Secretary shall call a Special General Membership Meeting to consider the subject specified in the request. No business other than that specified in the notice of the meeting shall be transacted at any Special General Membership Meeting. Such Special General Membership Meeting shall be scheduled to take place not less than ten (10) days after the request is received by the President or Secretary.

#### SECTION 8

**Rules of Order for General Membership Meetings.** Meetings will be run in a fair and business-like manner.

### ARTICLE VI - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

#### SECTION 1

**Authority.** The management of the property and affairs of the Local League shall be vested in the Board of Directors.

#### SECTION 2

**Increase in number.** The number of Board of Directors so fixed at the Annual Meeting may be increased at any General Membership Meeting or Special Meeting of the Members. If the number is increased, the additional Directors may be elected at the meeting at which the increase is voted, or at any subsequent General Membership Meeting. All elections of additional Directors shall be by majority vote of all Regular Members present or represented by a properly executed and signed absentee ballot filed with the Secretary prior to the election meeting.

#### SECTION 3

**Vacancies.** If any vacancy occurs in the Board of Directors, by death, resignation or otherwise, it may be filled by a majority vote of the remaining Directors at any regular Board meeting or at any Special Board Meeting called for that purpose.

**Removal of Directors:** The Board of Directors shall have the sole power and authority to remove a director and declare his or her office vacant if he or she: (1) has been declared of unsound mind by a final order of the court or by two licensed physicians who are unrelated to members of the Board of Directors; (2) has been convicted of a felony; or (3) fails to attend three consecutive properly noticed Board of Director Meetings. In exercising its discretion to remove a director for failure to attend, the Board may consider in mitigation medical hardship, business travel, or other factors the Board deems relevant in the sole discretion.

#### SECTION 4

**Term of Office.** Board positions are held for a one (1) year term with the President's tenure preferred (but not required) for a minimum of two years. There shall be no limit to the number of consecutive terms that may be served by a Director or Officer.

## SECTION 5

**Board Meetings, Notice and Quorum.** Regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held immediately following the Annual Meeting and on such days thereafter as shall be determined by the Board.

(a) The President or the Secretary may, whenever they deem it advisable, or the Secretary shall at the request in writing of FIVE Directors, issue a call for a Special Board Meeting. In the case of Special Board Meetings, such notice shall include the purpose of the meeting and no matters not so stated may be acted upon at the meeting.

(b) Notice of each Board meeting shall be given by the Secretary personally, electronically or by mail to each Director at least THREE day(s) before the time appointed for the meeting to the last recorded address of each Director.

(c) MAJORITY members of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. If a quorum is not present, no business shall be conducted.

(d) Only members of the Board of Directors may make motions and vote at meetings of the Board of Directors. However, the Board of Directors may invite, admit and recognize guests for presentations or comments during Board Meetings.

## SECTION 6

**Duties and Powers.** The Board of Directors shall have the power to appoint such standing committees as it shall determine appropriate and to delegate such powers to them as the Board shall deem advisable and which it may properly delegate.

The Board may adopt such rules and regulations for the conduct of its meetings and the management of the Local League as it may deem proper, provided such rules and regulations do not conflict with this Constitution.

The Board shall have the power by a two-thirds vote of those present at any regular Board or Special Board Meeting to discipline, suspend or remove any Director or Officer or Committee Member of the Local League in accordance with the procedure set forth in Article III, Section 4.

## SECTION 7

**Committees.** The President, with majority approval of the Board, may appoint various Committees to investigate, organize, or recommend solutions to various issues.

## SECTION 8

**Rules of Order for Board Meetings.** Meetings will be run in a fair and business-like manner.

## ARTICLE VII - DUTIES AND POWERS OF THE BOARD

### SECTION 1

**Appointments.** The Board of Directors may appoint such other officers or agents as it may deem necessary or desirable, and may prescribe the powers and duties of each. Appointed officers or agents shall have no vote on actions taken by the Board of Directors unless such individuals have been elected to the Board by the membership or have been elected to fill a vacancy on the Board.

**Indemnification:** Any person who was or is a Director, Officer, employee or other agent of Lakeside may be indemnified by Lakeside for any claims, demands, causes of actions, expenses or liabilities arising out of, or pertaining to, the Agent's service to or on behalf of Lakeside to the full extent permitted by California Corporations Code Section 7237.

### SECTION 2

**President.** The President shall:

(a) Conduct the affairs of the Local League and execute the policies established by the Board of Directors.

- (b) Present a report of the condition of the Local League at the Annual Meeting.
- (c) Communicate to the Board of Directors such matters as deemed appropriate, and make such suggestions as may tend to promote the welfare of the Local League.
- (d) Be responsible for the conduct of the Local League in strict conformity to the policies, principles, Rules and Regulations of Little League Baseball, Incorporated, as agreed to under the conditions of charter issued to the Local League by that organization.
- (e) Designate in writing other officers, if necessary, to have power to make and execute for/and in the name of the Local League such contracts and leases they may receive and which have had prior approval of the Board.
- (f) Investigate complaints, irregularities and conditions detrimental to the Local League and report thereon to the Board or Executive Committee as circumstances warrant.
- (g) Prepare and submit an annual budget to the Board of Directors and be responsible for the proper execution thereof.
- (h) With the assistance of the Player Agent and Registrar, examine the application and support proof-of age documents of every player candidate and certify to residence and age eligibility before the player may be accepted for tryouts and selection.

### SECTION 3

**Vice President – Baseball Operations.** The Vice President – Baseball Operations shall:

- (a) Perform the duties of the President in the absence or disability of the President, provided he or she is authorized by the President or Board so to act. When so acting, the Vice President-Baseball Operations shall have all the powers of that office.
- (b) Perform such duties as from time to time may be assigned by the Board of Directors or by the President.
- (c) Be the lead person for all things baseball-related within the Board of Directors.

### SECTION 4

**Vice President – Administrative.** The Vice President – Administrative shall:

- (a) Perform the duties of the President in the absence or disability of the President and Vice President-Baseball Operations, provided he or she is authorized by the President or Board so to act. When so acting, the Vice President-Administrative shall have all the powers of that office.
- (b) Perform such duties as from time to time may be assigned by the Board of Directors or by the President.
- (c) Be the lead person for all things that are not baseball-related within the Board of Directors.

### SECTION 5

**Secretary.** The Secretary shall:

- (a) Be responsible for recording the activities of the Local League and maintain appropriate files, mailing lists and necessary records.
- (b) Perform such duties as are herein specifically set forth, in addition to such other duties as are customarily incident to the office of Secretary or as may be assigned by the Board of Directors.
- (c) Maintain a list of all Regular, Sustaining and Honorary Members, Directors and committee members and give notice of all meetings of the Local League, the Board of Directors and committees.
- (d) Issue membership cards to Regular Members, if approved by the Board of Directors.
- (e) Keep the minutes of the meetings of the Members, the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee, and cause them to be recorded in a book kept for that purpose.
- (f) Conduct all correspondence not otherwise specifically delegated in connection with said meeting and shall be responsible for carrying out all orders, votes and resolutions not otherwise committed.
- (g) Notify Members, Directors, Officers and committee members of their election or appointment.

### SECTION 6

**Treasurer.** The Treasurer shall:

- (a) Perform such duties as are herein set forth and such other duties as are customarily incident to the Office of Treasurer or may be assigned by the Board of Directors.
- (b) Receive all moneys and securities, and deposit same in a depository approved by the Board of Directors.
- (c) Keep records for the receipt and disbursement of all moneys and securities of the Local League, including the Auxiliary, approve all payments from allotted funds and draw checks therefore in agreement with policies established in advance of such actions by the Board of Directors.
- (d) Prepare an annual budget, under the direction of the President, for submission to the Board of Directors at the Annual Meeting.
- (e) Prepare an annual financial report, under the direction of the President, for submission to the Membership and Board of Directors at the Annual Meeting, and to Little League International.

#### SECTION 7

**Player Agent.** The Player Agent shall:

- (a) Record all player transactions and maintain an accurate and up-to-date record thereof.
- (b) Receive and review applications for player candidates and assist the President in verifying residence and age eligibility.
- (c) Conduct the tryouts, the player draft and all other player transaction or selection meetings.
- (d) Prepare the Player Agent's list.
- (e) Prepare for the President's signature and submission to Little League International, team rosters, including players claimed, and the tournament team eligibility affidavit.
- (f) Notify Little League International of any subsequent player replacements or trades.
- (g) Administer the divisional player pool.
- (h) Act as point of contact for parent concerns.
- (i) Be responsible for interpreting and enforcing local league rules and Little League Green Book rules for assigned level of play.

#### SECTION 8

**Safety Officer.** The Safety Officer shall:

- (a) Be responsible to create awareness, through education and information, of the opportunities to provide a safer environment for children and all participants of Little League.
- (b) Develop and implement a plan for increasing safety of activities, equipment and facilities through education, compliance and reporting.

**NOTE:** In order to implement a safety plan using education, compliance and reporting, the following suggestions may be utilized by the Safety Officer:

- (1) Education - Should facilitate meetings and distribute information among participants including players, managers, coaches, umpires, league officials, parents, guardians and other volunteers.
- (2) Compliance - Should promote safety compliance leadership by increasing awareness of the safety opportunities that arise from these responsibilities.
- (3) Reporting - Define a process to assure that incidents are recorded, information is sent to league/district and national offices, and follow-up information on medical and other data is forwarded as available.

#### SECTION 9

**Coaching/Player Development.** The coaching coordinator shall:

- (a) Represent coaches/managers in league;
- (b) Present a coach/manager training budget to the board;
- (c) Gain the support and funds necessary to implement a league-wide training program;
- (d) Order and distribute training materials to players, coaches and managers;
- (e) Coordinate mini-clinics as necessary.

#### SECTION 10

**League Information Officer (Webmaster).** The League Information Officer shall:



- (a) Set up and manage the league's official website (site authorized by Little League International);
- (b) Set up online registration and ensure the league rosters are uploaded to Little League;
- (c) Assign online administrative rights to other local volunteers;
- (d) Encourage creation of team web sites to managers, coaches, and parents;
- (e) Ensure that league news and scores are updated online on a regular basis;
- (f) Collect, post, and distribute important information on league activities including direct dissemination of fund-raising and sponsor activities to Little League Baseball, Incorporated, the district, the public, league members, and the media;
- (g) Administration and for distributing information to league members and to Little League Baseball, Incorporated.
- (h) Serves as primary contact person for Little League regarding optimizing use of the Internet for league use.

#### **SECTION 11**

**Sponsorship/Fundraising/Events Manager.** The Sponsorship/Fundraising/Events Manager shall:

- (a) Solicits and secures local sponsorships to support league operations
- (b) Collects and reviews sponsorship and fundraising opportunities
- (c) Organizes and implements approved league fundraising activities
- (d) Coordinates participation in fundraising activities
- (e) Maintains records of monies secured through sponsorship and fundraising initiatives.

#### **SECTION 12**

**Concession Manager.** The Concession Manager shall:

- (a) Maintains the operation of concession facilities
- (b) Organizes the purchase of concession products
- (c) Responsible for the management of the concession sales at league events
- (d) Schedules volunteers to work the concession booth during league events
- (e) Collects and reviews concession related offers including coupons, discounts and bulk-purchasing opportunities
- (f) Organizes, tallies and keeps records of concession sales and purchases.

#### **SECTION 13**

**Registrar.** The Registrar shall:

- (a) Be responsible for recording maintaining Lakeside's Player Registration database and files.
- (b) Prepare for the President's signature and submission to Little League headquarters, team rosters, including players, and the tournament team eligibility affidavits.
- (c) Schedule and manage appropriate Registration dates.
- (d) Prepare for the Player Agent a listing of registered players in advance of evaluations.

#### **SECTION 14**

**Division Coordinators (Juniors, 50/70, Majors, AAA, AA, Farm, Rookie, and T-Ball):** The Division Coordinators shall:

- (a) Help find managers and coaches for their respective divisions.
- (b) Work with the Player Agent as needed to resolve parent concerns within their division.
- (c) For Farm, Rookie, and T-Ball, work with the Player Agent to develop rosters.
- (d) Disseminate information from the Board of Directors to the managers and coaches within their division.

#### **SECTION 15**

**Umpire in Chief:** The Umpire in Chief shall:

- (a) Administer contracts with agencies providing Major-Senior Division umpiring.

- (b) Communicate with any external agencies schedule changes or additional games.
- (c) Provide feedback and evaluation to contracting agencies on the demeanor and effectiveness of assigned Umpires.
- (d) Generate recruitment and training of the Junior Umpire program for Minor division support.
- (e) In conjunction with Player Agent and Division Coordinators, schedule umpires as required to support non-contracted Divisions.

#### SECTION 16

**Team Parent Coordinator:** The Team Parent Coordinator shall be responsible for finding and communicating with Team Parents.

#### SECTION 17

**Uniform Coordinator:** The Uniform Coordinator shall be responsible for ordering all uniforms for League needs.

#### SECTION 18

**Capital Improvements Coordinator:** The Capital Improvements Coordinator shall be responsible for anything related to capital improvements at Local League facilities, including, but not limited to, gathering bids, purchasing materials (in conjunction with the Treasurer), presenting a budget and priority list of projects to the Board on an annual basis.

#### SECTION 19

**Fields Coordinator.** The Fields Coordinator shall be responsible for the coordination of an annual Field Day (as needed), for the overall conditions of the Local League playing facilities, and implementing procedures for teams to follow in caring for the fields.

#### SECTION 20

**Equipment Coordinator.** The Equipment Coordinator shall be responsible for determining the equipment requirements to support the Local League, prepare and submit a budget for equipment requirements, procure and distribute equipment to Managers, manage and return and inventory equipment at the end of the season.

#### SECTION 21

**Board Members at Large.** Board Member(s) at large have no formal responsibility. A Board Member at Large is someone who supports a number of other positions on the Board of Directors as needed.

### ARTICLE VIII - EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

#### SECTION 1

The Board of Directors may appoint an Executive Committee which shall consist of not less than three (3) nor more than five (5) Directors, one of whom shall be the President of the Local League.

#### SECTION 2

The Executive Committee shall advise with and assist the Officers of the Local League in all matters concerning its interests and the management of its affairs, and shall have such other powers as may be delegated to it by the Board, but in no event will the Executive Committee have authority over the Board of Directors.

### SECTION 3

At any meeting of the Executive Committee, a majority of the total number of members then in office shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and the act of a majority present at any meeting at which there is a quorum shall be the act of the Committee.

## ARTICLE IX - OTHER COMMITTEES

### SECTION 1

**All Committees.** The President shall make recommendations on any committee to be established for the purposes of carrying out any business related to Lakeside. Any Committee shall be approved by a majority of the Board of Directors.

## ARTICLE X - AFFILIATION

### SECTION 1

**Charter.** The Local League shall annually apply for a charter from Little League Baseball, Incorporated, and shall do all things necessary to obtain and maintain such charter. The Local League shall devote its entire energies to the activities authorized by such charter and it shall not be affiliated with any other program or organization or operate any other program.

### SECTION 2

**Rules and Regulations.** The Official Playing Rules and Regulations as published by Little League Baseball, Incorporated, Williamsport, Pennsylvania, shall be binding on this Local League.

### SECTION 3

**Local Rules, Ground Rules and/or Bylaws.** The local rules, ground rules and/or bylaws of this Local League shall be adopted by the Board of Directors at a meeting to be held not less than two weeks previous to the first scheduled game of the season, but shall in no way conflict with the Rules, Regulations and Policies of Little League Baseball, Incorporated, nor shall they conflict with this Constitution. The local rules, ground rules and/or bylaws of this Local League shall expire at the end of each fiscal year, and are not considered part of this Constitution. (See Article XI, Section 7 for fiscal year of this league.)

## ARTICLE XI - FINANCIAL AND ACCOUNTING

### SECTION 1

**Authority.** The Board of Directors shall decide all matters pertaining to the finances of the Local League and it shall place all income including Auxiliary funds, in a common league treasury, directing the expenditure of funds in such manner as will give no individual or team an advantage over those in competition with such individual or team.

### SECTION 2

**Contributions.** The Board shall not permit the contribution of funds or property to individual teams but shall solicit funds for the common treasury of the Local League, thereby to discourage favoritism among teams and to endeavor to equalize the benefits of the Local League.

### SECTION 3

**Solicitations.** The Board shall not permit the solicitation of funds in the name of Little League Baseball, Incorporated unless all of the funds so raised be placed in the Local League treasury.

**SECTION 4**

**Disbursement of Funds.** The Board shall not permit the disbursement of Local League funds for other than the conduct of Little League activities in accordance with the rules, regulations and policies of Little League Baseball, Incorporated. All disbursements shall be made by check. All checks shall be signed by the Local League Treasurer or such other officer or officers or person or persons as the Board of Directors shall determine.

**SECTION 5**

**Compensation.** No Director, Officer or Member of the Local League shall receive, directly or indirectly any salary, compensation or emolument from the Local League for services rendered as Director, Officer or Member.

**SECTION 6**

**Deposits.** All moneys received, including Auxiliary Funds, shall be deposited to the credit of the Local League in/at Central Valley Community Bank.

**SECTION 7**

**Fiscal year.** The fiscal year of the Local League shall begin on October 1 and shall end on September 30.

**SECTION 8**

**Distribution of Property upon Dissolution.** Upon dissolution of the Local League and after all outstanding debts and claims have been satisfied, the Members shall direct the remaining property of the Local League to another Federally Incorporated entity which maintains the same objectives as set forth in Article II of this Constitution, which are or may be entitled to exemption under Section 501-(c)-(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or any future corresponding provision.

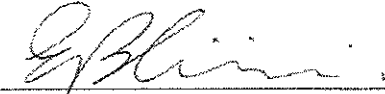
**ARTICLE XII - AMENDMENTS**

This Constitution may be amended, repealed or altered in whole or in part by a majority vote at any duly organized meeting of the Members provided notice of the proposed change is included in the notice of such meeting.

Draft of all proposed amendments shall be submitted to Little League Baseball, Incorporated, for approval before implementation.
