TODAY'S GAME

The U.S. Men's National Team faces Germany today in its fifth of seven preliminary round games in the 2025 IIHF Men's World Championship in Herning, Denmark. All Team USA games air live on NHL Network.

THE SERIES VS. GERMANY

The U.S. and Germany meet today for the 24th time in the IIHF Men's World Championship. The U.S. is 14-0-2-4-3 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) against Germany all-time. The U.S. earned a 5-2 win over Germany in pre-tournament action on May 4 in Dusseldorf, Germany, behind two goals each from **Tage Thompson** and **Frank Nazar** (see boxscore later in these notes). The teams met in last year's preliminary round and Team USA gained a 6-1 win. Defenseman **Michael Kesselring** made a highlight-reel deke for Team USA's second goal, which proved to be the game-winner.

The U.S. is the home team for the fourth straight game today, will wear its blue jerseys and occupy the left bench ... **Zeev Buium**, **Isaac Howard** and **Hampton Slukynsky** will not dress today ... Team USA had the last two days off. Outside of treatments and a brief team meeting, Thursday (May 15) was completely off. The U.S. returned to the ice yesterday to get ready for its game today vs. Germany ... The U.S. took its team picture at the outset of practice yesterday ... **Pat Kelleher**, executive director of USA Hockey, arrived in Herning yesterday and will be here through the preliminary round ... U.S. forward **Mikey Eyssimont** has become a big tennis fan over the past few years. He plays a couple of times a week in the off-season ... Today's game is Team USA's second with a 12:20 p.m. start time. The other was on May 11 and resulted in a 6-0 win over Hungary ... **Bill Guerin**, general manager of the Minnesota Wild and also the 2026 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team, is at today's game ... **Cutter Gauthier** has 11 career goals in the men's world championship. Brock Nelson and Bruce Mather share the top spot in the U.S. record books with 19 career goals.

LAST TIME OUT

In its last game, Team USA gained a 6-5 overtime win over Norway on Wednesday (May 14). **Tage Thompson** recorded three goals, including the game-winner, to lead a U.S. offense that included 12 players contributing at least one point. Captain **Clayton Keller** added a goal and two assists and **Logan Cooley** had two assists.

TOURNAMENT STATISTICAL LEADERS

Cutter Gauthier is tied for fourth in the world championship with four goals ... **Logan Cooley** is third in the men's worlds in faceoff percentage at .708 (46-65), while **Mike McCarron** is 10th at .622 (23-27) ... **Zach Werenski** is tops in the tournament in average time on ice at 31:38 ... **Joey Daccord** is third in the men's worlds in save percentage at .943 and tied for fifth in goals against average at 1.50 ... **Will Smith** is tied for ninth in assists with four ... The U.S. has three players at +6 in **Matty Beniers**, **Gauthier** and **Smith**, which is one off the tournament's top spot.

And prior to Tkachuk was a three-goal effort from **Cutter Gauthier** in a 9-0 victory against France on May 22, 2023.

USA vs. Germany • Saturday, May 17, 2025

FROM PREVIOUS VERSIONS OF GAME NOTES

U.S. defenseman **Mason Lohrei** started watching tennis a few years back and is hooked. He now plays with his buddies in the off-season regularly and shares that his favorite American player is Tommy Paul and he also enjoys watching Carlos Alcaraz and Jannik Sinner ... **Joey Daccord** made 26 stops in in Team USA's 5-0 shutout of Denmark on May 9. The U.S. had one shutout in last year's world championship, that a 5-0 blanking of France when **Alex Nedeljkovic** made 10 saves in the U.S. net. It was the most saves in a shutout win in the world championship for a U.S. goaltender since **Jeremy Swayman** stopped 33 shots in a 3-0 win over Switzerland in the quarterfinals of the 2022 tournament in Tampere, Finland ... **Ryan Warsofsky** is the head coach of Team USA in the world championship for the first time. He was an assistant coach for the U.S. entry in the 2023 world championship where the team won its first eight games in the tournament for the first time ever ... **Mike Vellucci** is leading the U.S. power play, while **Kevin Dean** is in charge of the U.S. penalty kill ... U.S. defenseman **Brady Skjei's** wife's sister is engaged to Carolina Hurricanes netminder Frederik Andersen, who is from Herring. Skjei was here in Herring last summer with family and will return next summer for the wedding ... A total of 13 players part of Team USA have previously played in the IIHF Men's World Championship. The group includes **Matty Beniers** (2021), **Mikey Eyssimont** (2023, 2024), **Conor Garland** (2021, 2023), **Cutter Gauthier** (2023), **Clayton Keller** (2017, 2019), **Michael Kesselring** (2024), **Drew O'Connor** (2023), **Andrew Peeke** (2-23), **Shane Pinto** (2024), **Brady Skjei** (2016, 2017, 2019), **Jeremy Swayman** (2022), **Tage Thompson** (2018, 2021), and **Zach Werenski** (2018, 2024) ... **John Vanbiesbroeck**, who oversees all international hockey for USA Hockey and is part of the management staff of the U.S. Men's National Team, played in 31 career games in the men's world championship, the most of any netminder in U.S. history.

HOSTING WORLD EVENTS

The U.S. is hosting the **IPC World Para Ice Hockey Championship** May 24-31 in Buffalo, N.Y. The eight-nation tournament features the best sled hockey players in the world and returns to the U.S. for the first time since 2015. The U.S. has won three of the last four gold medals in the world championship and has medaled in 11 of the 13 world championships contested all-time. The U.S. will also be hosting the 50th anniversary of the **IIHF World Junior Championship** in Saint Paul and Minneapolis, Minnesota, Dec. 26, 2025 - Jan. 5, 2026. Team USA has won the last two gold medals in the World Juniors.

GENERAL MANAGER KEALTY

Jeff Kealty, general manager of the U.S. Men's National Team, is the assistant general manager of the NHL's Nashville Predators. He played college hockey at Boston University and competed for Team USA at the 1996 IIHF World Junior Championship. Kealty played one full season of professional hockey for the IHL's Milwaukee Admirals following his time at BU.

ZACH WERENSKI

Defenseman **Zach Werenski** joined Team USA late morning on May 12. He would have likely played against Switzerland that day, however, his equipment did not arrive. Werenski, who is serving as an alternate captain for the U.S., played for Team USA in February's 4 Nations Face-Off and was also part of the U.S. squad in last year's world championship. He plays for the NHL's Columbus Blue Jackets and is one of three finalists for the Norris Trophy as the league's top defenseman after registering 82 points (23G, 59A) in 81 games played. Werenski is Columbus' nominee for the King Clancy Memorial Trophy, which is presented annually to the NHL player who best exemplifies leadership qualities on and off the ice and has made a noteworthy humanitarian contribution in his community. He played one season at USA Hockey's National Team Development Program before embarking on a two-year stint in college hockey at the University of Michigan.

TEAM USA'S ALL-TIME MEN'S WORLDS MEDALS

The U.S. has won 13 medals in the men's world championship, earning gold once (1933), silver four times (1950, 1939, 1934, 1931) and bronze on eight occasions (2021, 2018, 2015, 2013, 2004, 1996, 1952, 1949). Of Team USA's eight bronze medals, six were claimed by winning bronze-medal games while two came via tournament standings and round-robin play.

NTDP IMPACT

A total of 14 players on the U.S. Men's National Team roster played at USA Hockey's highly acclaimed National Team Development Program in Plymouth, Mich. (greater Detroit). The group includes **Matty Beniers**, **Zeev Buium**, **Logan Cooley**, **Cutter Gauthier**, **Hampton Slukynsky**, **Isaac Howard**, **Clayton Keller**, **Mike McCarron**, **Frank Nazar**, **Brady Skjei**, **Will Smith**, **Tage Thompson**, **Alex Vlasic** and **Zach Werenski**. Slukynsky played just three games at the NTDP in 2022-23, while both Tage Thompson (2014-15) and Zach Werenski (2013-14) competed one season. The others players went through the traditional two seasons of the program.

GAUDREAU REMEMBRANCE

Team USA's lockerroom includes a tribute to Johnny and Matthew Gaudreau who died tragically on August 29 when they were struck by a motor vehicle while riding their bicycles. Above the door where Team USA exits, an enlarged helmet decal with Johnny and Matthew's numbers is in place. And a small version of the decal is on the back of the helmet of Team USA's players (and has been used on helmets of U.S. teams at all levels in international play this season). In addition, Johnny's jersey hangs in Team USA's lockerroom. Johnny played in last year's IIHF Men's World Championship and broke the all-time U.S. career marks for points and assists, both which were previously held by Patrick Kane. Johnny scored the last goal of his superstar career on May 19 against Kazakhstan in Tampere, Finland.

THE JOURNEY

U.S. players and staff arrived in Frankfurt, Germany, on May 2 from their home bases in the U.S. and took the 2.5-hour journey via charter bus to Dusseldorf, Germany, where the U.S. had a three-day camp that culminated with its lone pre-tournament game vs. Germany on Sunday (May 4) -- a 5-2 victory fueled by two goals each from Tage Thompson and Frank Nazar. Team USA flew with Team Germany on May 5 to Herning.

IN DENMARK

The only other time the IIHF Men's World Championship has been staged in Denmark was in 2018 when Team USA went 6-2-0-2 and earned a bronze medal on the strength of a 4-1 victory over Canada in the bronze-medal game. The only player on this year's team who played in that tournament is **Tage Thompson**, who in 10 games, had 1-2--3. U.S. assistant coach **Adam Nightingale** was part of the 2018 team as video coordinator, while massage therapist **Peewee Willmann** was also part of the 2018 squad in the same capacity. That 2018 team also included **Johnny Gaudreau**. In addition, a jersey of the late Jim Johannson (who had oversight of all U.S. teams in international play for USA Hockey) was part of the team photo. Johannson passed away in January 2018, just prior to the Olympic Winter Games. **Patrick Kane** served as captain of the 2018 U.S. Men's National Team and was named tournament MVP (the only U.S. player to ever earn the honor), while contributing a U.S. single-tournament record 20 points, including eight goals.

LEADERSHIP

Clayton Keller is the captain of Team USA. He serves as the captain of the NHL's Utah Mammoth. Keller has played for Team USA on the world stage in five previous world championships at various levels, including two men's world championships (2017, 2019). The U.S. has four alternate captains in **Zach Werenski**, **Brady Skjei**, **Tage Thompson** and **Conor Garland**. The four have competed in a combined nine men's worlds.

WARSOFSKY AMONG THE YOUNGEST

LEGENDARY STAN WONG

Stan Wong marks his 57th appearance on the staff of a U.S. team on the international stage here in Herning. He is part of the Team USA staff for the 18th IIHF Men's World Championship and has worked the last 23 IIHF World Junior Championships. He has also been an athletic trainer for the last five U.S. Olympic men's hockey teams, 10 Deutschland Cup squads and for Team USA at the 2012 Youth Olympic Games. Wong was inducted into the Professional Hockey Athletic Trainers Hall of Fame in June 2015.

NOT MANY 19-YEAR-OLD NETMINDERS

U.S. netminder **Hampton Slukynsky** is 19 years-old and the one of the youngest goaltenders to ever play for Team USA in the IIHF Men's World Championship.
