## TONIGHT'S GAME

The United States faces Finland here tonight at Canadian Tire Centre in the gold-medal game of the 2025 IIHF World Junior Championship. Team USA used 26 saves from **Trey Augustine** and goals from four different players in a 4-1 win over Czechia in the semifinals last night (Jan. 4).

### TEAM USA IN GOLD-MEDAL GAME

The U.S. is 6-2 (W-L) all-time in the gold-medal game of the IIHF World Junior Championship. Team USA has played Finland just once in the gold-medal game and dropped a 3-2 decision in 2019.

### ONLY GOLD MEDAL MEETING

The U.S. and Finland have met once in the gold-medal game of the World Juniors and that came on Jan. 5, 2019 in Vancouver at Rogers Place. After a scoreless first period, Finland's Jessi Ylonen got the only goal of the middle frame before Otto Latvala scored 6:00 into the third to stake the Finns to a 2-0 advantage. The U.S. got two goals in a 1:46 span -- at 7:01 from Sasha Chmelevski and from Josh Norris at 8:47 -- to even the contest, but Kaapo Kakko scored the game-winner with 1:26 left. Team USA was 0-5 on the power play while Finland was 1-3. Cayden Primeau made 28 saves for the U.S., while Ukko-Pekka Luukkonen had 26 saves for Finland.

### U.S. VERSUS FINLAND

The U.S. and Finland will meet for the 40th time in the World Juniors today and the series is dead even with each team having won 19 times with one tie (16-3-1-18-1/W-OTW-OTL-L-T). ### ALL ABOUT MEDALS

For the first time ever, the U.S. is in the gold-medal game of the World Juniors in back-to-back tournaments. The U.S. is aiming to win back-to-back gold medals for the first time. A gold medal would represent the third championship in the last five years for the U.S. Team USA will medal for the eighth time in the last 10 World Juniors, an unprecedented stretch for the United States. Further, the U.S. will medal in the tournament for the third straight year, one short of the American record of four straight from 2016-19.

### THREE BEST PLAYERS

Captain **Ryan Leonard**, forward **Danny Nelson** and defenseman **Cole Hutson** have been named Team USA's Three Best Players of the Tournament. Cole Hutson's brother, Lane, was one of Team USA's Three Best Players in last year's tournament.

### QUITE THE CAREER FOR AUGUSTINE BEFORE HITTING 20

Goaltender **Trey Augustine** is just 19 years old and has already played in 27 career IIHF world championship games (including U18, U20 and Men's Worlds). He has been the goalie of record in 25 of those contests and has 21 wins to his credit (20-1-1-3/W-OTW-OTL-L). Augustine owns a 2.19 GAA and .915 save percentage over his 27 games. He enters play today with 11 career World Junior victories, tops all-time in the U.S. record book. The South Lyon, Mich., native has a gold (2024) and bronze (2023) medal to his credit in the World Juniors, and with Team USA guaranteed a medal this year, will join Yevgeni Belosheikin (URS), Marc Denis (CAN), Andrei Medvedev (RUS), Jamie Storr (CAN) and Alexander Tyzhnyh (URS) as the only netminders in WJC history to win three medals in the tournament. Augustine also earned a silver (2022) and gold medal (2023) in the IIHF U18 Men's World Championship and was part of the U.S. Men's National Team for the 2024 IIHF Men's Worlds (3GP, 1.37, .923).

### PAGE ONE NIBBLES

The U.S. is the home team tonight and will wear its blue jerseys ... **Ryan Leonard** scored the game-winning goal 2:20 into overtime off a feed from **Cole Hutson** to lift the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team to gold in the 2023 IIHF U18 Men's World Championship in Basel, Switzerland. Team USA trailed 2-0 after two periods. **Danny Nelson** scored the first U.S. goal off a tip-in of **Zeev Buium's** shot at 9:44 of the third, before **Carey Terrance** tallied with 3:16 to play on the power play to tie the contest. **Trey Augustine** had 28 saves in goal to pick up the win. Leonard also put a dagger in any comeback hopes for Sweden, scoring Team USA's fifth goal with under four minutes to play in last year's 6-2 win in the gold-medal game of the World Juniors. **Trey Augustine** made 24 saves ... The U.S. will host next year's World Junior Championship in Saint Paul and Minneapolis, Minnesota. It will be the 50th anniversary of the tournament. **Murray Williamson**, who played at the University of Minnesota and coached two U.S. Olympic Teams (1968, 1972-silver), had the original idea for the World Juniors. The 90-year-old Williamson lives in the Twin Cities.

### USHL IMPACT

The United States Hockey League, the only Tier I junior league in the U.S., has had more NHL draft picks than any league in the world over the last eight seasons. Team USA's roster includes 23 players who have played in the USHL, with the only two exceptions being Sam Hillebrandt and Joey Willis.

## FROM PREVIOUS EDITIONS OF GAME NOTES

U.S. captain **Ryan Leonard** played with Johnny Gaudreau on the U.S. Men's National Team at the 2024 IIHF Men's World Championship this past May in Ostrava and Prague, Czechia. Leonard reflected on his time with Johnny after practice on Jan. 3. Watch it [here](#) ... Team USA had dinner at Harmons in downtown Ottawa on Jan. 3. The team sang happy birthday to **Austin Burnevik**, who turned 20 that day. In addition, **Max Plante** entertained the group, singing a stirring version of John Legend's All of Me ... The U.S. record for most points by a defenseman in a single World Juniors is 10, held by **Ryan Ufko** (2023, 7GP, 1-9--10), **Erik Johnson** (2007, 7GP, 4-6--10) and **Tom Pederson** (1989, 7GP, 2-8--10). A defenseman has not finished as the points leader for Team USA in the WJC since 2014 when **Matt Grzelczyk** had 2-4--6 in 5GP and tied with forward **Riley Barber** (5GP, 2-4--6) as the top U.S. point-getter. In 2013, defenseman **Jacob Trouba** (7GP, 4-5--9) also tied for the U.S. point lead with forwards **J.T. Miller** (7GP, 2-7--9) and **Johnny Gaudreau** (7GP, 7-2--9) ... The U.S. allowed 44 shots on goal in its 4-3 overtime loss to Finland on Dec. 29. It was the most Team USA allowed in 48 games, dating back to the 2017 gold-medal game where Canada had 50 shots on net in a 5-4 shootout loss to the U.S. on Jan. 5 in the gold-medal game ... The U.S. enjoyed Italian cuisine outside the hotel on Dec. 30 at Giovanni's. At the end of the meal, a bowl of ice cream intended for U.S. trainer **Stan Wong** was inadvertently delivered to equipment manager **Scott Aldrich**. The restaurant staff added a candle with sparklers to the bowl of ice cream and lit it. That prompted the team to think it was Aldrich's birthday and they proceeded to sing a robust version of happy birthday to him. It was, however, not his birthday ... Goaltender **Hampton Siukynsky** earned his first win in the World Juniors on Dec. 28 vs. Latvia and his first-ever win in an IIHF event. He made 25 saves on 26 shots in the victory ... Team USA's goal song is Free Bird by Lynyrd Skynyrd. Potential goal songs were discussed by veterans on the bus ride from Michigan to Kingston, Ont. The song was first brought up as an option by Zeev Buium and wound up sticking ... Legendary athletic trainer **Stan Wong** marks his 56th appearance on the staff of a U.S. team on the international stage. He is working his 23rd straight IIHF World Junior Championship in 2025 and has also been an athletic trainer for the last five U.S. Olympic men's hockey teams in addition to 17 U.S. men's national teams, 10 Deutschland Cup squads and for Team USA at the 2012 Youth Olympic Games ... U.S. equipment manager **Nick Meldrum**, who spent two years as an equipment manager at USA Hockey's National Team Development Program (2007-09), is in his 16th season leading hockey equipment operations for the University of Denver. Meldrum shares that the trio of head coach **George Gwozdecky**, and assistant coaches **Derek Lalonde** and **Steve Miller** were involved in hiring him at DU with an endorsement from legendary U.S. coach **Tim Taylor** helping the cause ... **James Hagens** recorded 9-13--22 in seven games in the 2024 IIHF U18 Men's Worlds to break Nikita Kucherov's single tournament points record.

## U18 WOMEN OFF TO 2-0 START

Earlier today in Vantaa, Finland, the U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team earned a 3-0 win over Sweden in the preliminary round of the IIHF U18 Women's World Championship. The U.S. is 2-0 and will face Finland on Tuesday at 10 a.m. ET (live on NHL Network). U.S. netminder **Morgan Stickney** (Manhattan Beach, Calif.) earned her second shutout of the tournament with 21 saves.

## THIS AND THAT

With one more point, **Gabe Perreault** will record his 20th career World Juniors point and tie Logan Cooley (2022-23), Brian Rolston (1991-93) and Mike Modano (1988-89) for fifth in U.S. history. Perreault's next assist will mark his 14th career helper in the World Juniors and tie him with Doug Weight for the fourth spot in the U.S. record books ... The U.S. record in the World Juniors for career goals by a defenseman is seven, held by current Columbus Blue Jackets general manager Don Waddell who played in the first two World Juniors in 1977 and 1978. **Zeev Buium** has five career goals, tied for second with Luke Hughes and Erik Johnson ... The U.S. has a streak of 14 straight games in the World Juniors without losing in regulation. Team USA's last regulation loss was in the semifinals of the 2023 tournament ... Team USA has scored first in five of its six games (and also in both pre-tournament games). The only game in which it did not score first was against Finland on Dec. 29 ... USA Hockey president **Mike Trimboli**, executive director **Pat Kelleher** and vice president **Dwayne Dillinger** are in Ottawa for tonight's gold-medal game.

## HISTORY OF THE Z'S

Team USA has two Z's on its team -- **Zeev Buium** and **Brodie Ziemer** -- for the third time ever. In 2020, the U.S. National Junior Team included **Trevor Zegras** and **Zac Jones**, while in 1990 the U.S. had **Jason Zent** and **Doug Zmolek**. All-time, the U.S. has had eight players whose last name begins with Z (Ziemer, F, 2025; **Jeff Zatkoff**, G, 2007; **Zegras**, F, 2020-21; **Zent**, F, 1990; **Sean Zimmerman**, D, 2007; **Zmolek**, D, 1990; **Rick Zombo**, D, 1983; **Jason Zucker**, F, 2010-12) and five with a first name that begins with Z (**Zach Werenski**, D, 2015-16; **Zach Stepan**, F, 2014; **Zach Parise**, F, 2003-04; **Zac Jones**, D, 2020; **Buium**, D, 2024-25).

## A GAUDREAU SALUTE

All U.S. national teams are wearing a helmet sticker this season in tribute to Johnny and Matthew Gaudreau, who were tragically killed by on August 29, 2024, while riding their bicycles. Johnny played for the U.S. National Junior Team in 2013 and helped Team USA to gold with a team-leading seven goals. He also co-led the squad in points with nine. Gaudreau was a regular playing for Team USA on the international stage, including this past May at the IIHF Men's World Championship where he set U.S. career tournament marks for most points and assists. In Team USA's lockerroom here at the World Juniors, two enlarged helmet decals are part of the decor as well as a stall with Johnny's jersey.

## LEADERSHIP GROUP

Forward **Ryan Leonard** (Amherst, Mass.), who returns to the U.S. National Junior Team after helping the squad earn a gold medal a year ago, is the captain of the 2025 U.S. National Junior Team. Leonard was part of the 2024 U.S. Men's National Team and has a gold and silver medal to his credit in the IIHF U18 Men's World Championship. He scored the OT winner in the 2023 gold-medal game of the U18 Worlds against Sweden. Forwards **Oliver Moore** (Mounds View, Minn.), **Danny Nelson** (Maple Grove, Minn.) and **Gabe Perreault** (Hinsdale, Ill.), along with defenseman **Zeev Buium** (San Diego, Calif.) are serving as alternate captains. All four were part of the 2024 U.S. National Junior Team.

## MINNESOTA TO HOST 50TH ANNIVERSARY WJC

Minnesota, fondly known as the "State of Hockey" in the United States, will play host to the 50th anniversary of the IIHF World Junior Hockey Championship next year with the Xcel Energy Center in the capital city of Saint Paul, and 3M Arena at Mariucci, serving as the playing venues. All session ticket package are now on sale at 2026.worldjuniors.hockey. The U.S. last hosted the World Juniors in 2018 in Buffalo, N.Y., where it staged the first and only outdoor game in tournament history.

## HOSTING WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

USA Hockey will serve as host to two world championships this season, including the 2025 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship from April 25-May 5 in Frisco and Allen, Texas, (greater Dallas), and the 2025 IPC Para Sled Hockey World Championship from May 24-31 in Buffalo, New York.

## 4 NATIONS FACE-OFF

The U.S. Men's National Team will play in the 4 Nations Face-Off, Feb. 12-20, in Montreal and Boston. The four-team tournament, featuring the top NHL players from the U.S., Canada, Finland and Sweden, is the first best-on-best senior level men's competition since the 2014 Olympic Winter Games. Bill Guerin is the general manager of Team USA, while Mike Sullivan is serving as head coach. The roster includes three Stanley Cup champions in Matthew Tkachuk, Jack Eichel and Jake Guentzel, along with 15 players who have played at USA Hockey's National Team Development Program.

### ABOUT VANBIESBROUCK

John Vanbiesbrouck is the general manager of the 2025 U.S. National Junior Team, marking his seventh straight season serving in the capacity. The 2007 U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame inductee has previously represented the United States as a player on nine occasions, including one Olympic Winter Games (1998), two Canada Cups (1987, 1991), four men's world championships (1985, 1987, 1989, 1991) and two world junior championships (1982, 1983). A full-time employee of USA Hockey, Vanbiesbrouck began his duties as assistant executive director of hockey operations for USA Hockey on June 4, 2018. His responsibilities include oversight of all of USA Hockey's international efforts, including its men's, women's and sled programs as well as the National Junior Development Program.

### ABOUT CARLE

David Carle is serving as head coach of the U.S. National Junior Team for the second straight year after leading the team to a gold medal in last year's IIHF World Junior Championship. In his seventh season as head coach of the University of Denver's men's ice hockey team in 2024-25, Carle has led the Pioneers to four NCAA tournament appearances overall in his tenure as head coach at DU, including both the 2024 and 2022 NCAA title. Prior to being named head coach, Carle served four-and-a-half seasons as an assistant coach with Denver (2014-18), joining the program in 2014 following a season-and-a-half as an assistant coach (2012-14) with the Green Bay Gamblers of the United States Hockey League. As a player, Carle was recruited to play at Denver and spent four seasons (2008-12) as a graduate assistant coach after a medical diagnosis forced him to retire from his playing career. A 2008 NHL Draft-eligible prospect, Carle was drafted in the fourth round, 203rd overall, by the Tampa Bay Lightning.

### ASSISTANT COACHES

USA Hockey has the same group of assistant coaches from last year's gold medal-winning U.S. National Junior Team, including NCAA Division I head coaches Brett Larson (St. Cloud State University) and Garrett Raboin (Augustana University); University of Minnesota associate head coach Steve Miller; and David Lassonde, who serves as the national goaltending coach for USA Hockey. The U.S. also returns Travis Culhane as video coach and Brian Gallivan, the performance coach at USA Hockey's National Team Development Program.
