TODAY'S GAME

Team USA enters the quarterfinals against Czechia after they finished out preliminary-round play with a perfect 4-0-0-0 record at the 2023 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship.

Tonight's game will be the 20th career meeting between Team USA and Czechia at the U18 World Championship, the sixth quarterfinal matchup. Team USA is 4-0-1-0 through the first five.

All of Team USA's games at the 2023 IIHF Under-18 World Championship will take place at St. Jakob Arena in Basel, Switzerland, home of the Swiss League's EHC Basel. The arena holds 6,700 spectators for hockey games.

TALKING POINTS

PRELIMINARY ROUND VS. SWITZERLAND

Ryan Leonard (Amherst, Mass.) collected three goals and two assists while **Gabe Perreault** (Hinsdale, Ill.) and **Will Smith** (Lexington, Mass.) added four points apiece as the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team defeated Switzerland, 10-0, Tuesday afternoon to sweep preliminary-round play.

HEAR IT FROM COACH

"We got that huge goal early and that helped set the stage for the game," said **Dan Muse** (Canton, Mass.), head coach of the 2023 U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team. "We'll take advantage of the day tomorrow and we're excited for the quarterfinals on Thursday."

LEADING THE PACK

The U.S. top line of **Gabe Perreault** (Hinsdale, Ill.), **Will Smith** (Lexington, Mass.) and **Ryan Leonard** (Amherst, Mass.) are having a prolific start to the 2023 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship as they are the three leading scorers of the entire tournament.

Perreault and Smith own identical lines of five goals, 10 assists and 15 points through four preliminary-round games while Leonard has added six goals and seven helpers for 13 points. The trio combined on seven goals in the first four matchups that featured the three players as the goal scorer and both assists.

Smith's 12 career assists and Leonard's 11 career goals in this tournament both rank sixth best by a U.S. player. Both players also have 18 career points, again tied for sixth-most by any Team USA player.

Perreault's 15 points ties Patrick O'Sullivan in 2002 for most career points by a player who only competed in one IIHF U18 World Championship.

TAG TEAM

Goaltenders **Trey Augustine** (South Lyon, Mich.) and **Carsen Musser** (Sherburn, Minn.) teamed up to collect a shutout in Team USA's 10-0 win over Switzerland on Tuesday. It was the first zero allowed by the U.S. since April 25, 2019, a 6-0 quarterfinal win over Finland that featured 21 stops from Spencer Knight.

The pair of goalies have been steady for Team USA. Augustine ranks third among all qualified goaltenders with a 1.96 GAA and .912 SV% on his way to a 3-0-0 record. Musser picked up the other win, and has stellar 0.75 and .947 marks in the same categories in 80 minutes of action.

TOURNAMENT INFO

The 2023 International Ice Hockey Federation Under-18 Men's World Championship will take place April 20-30, 2023, in Basel and Porrentruy, Switzerland. The U.S. enters the tournament off of a silver-medal finish at the 2022 event in Germany. Team USA has 10 gold medals in tournament history, the most of any competing country.

Team USA will play its preliminary-round games in Basel at St. Jakob Arena against Group B opponents Finland, Latvia, Norway and Switzerland. The quarterfinal round will be split between Basel and Porrentruy while both semifinals and medal-round games will all take place in Basel.

Group A consists of Canada, Czechia, Germany, Slovakia and Sweden and they will play their games at Raffeisen Arena in Porrentruy.

WATCH ON NHL NETWORK

NHL Network will provide exclusive telecasts of all Team USA games at the 2023 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship. The network will air all Team USA games live throughout the tournament, which begins Thursday (April 20) and runs through April 30 in Basel and Porrentruy, Switzerland.

ADDITIONAL NOTES

ON THE BOARD

Defenseman **Drew Fortescue** (Pearl River, N.Y.) buried a second-chance opportunity to put the U.S. ahead just 15 seconds into Tuesday's 10-0 win over Switzerland. The goal was not only his first of the tournament, but first of the 2022-23 campaign for Fortescue. The blueliner had previously racked up 23 assists, including a pair of three-point performances against NCAA opponents Utica and Mercyhurst.

THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT

Team USA rosters three 2006-birth year players, all of whom have contributed greatly to the team's 4-0-0-0 start to the tournament.

Defenseman **Cole Hutson** (Barrington, Ill.) ranks t-1st among all blueliners with seven points, all assists. The points bring his season total 63 points (9g-54a), two away from Cam York's 65 (14g-51a), the most ever by a defenseman at USA Hockey's National Team Development Program.

Forward **James Hagens** (Hauppauge, N.Y.) has points in all four tournament games and his five total (1g-4a) ranks within the event's top-20. The 2025 draft-eligible prospect also netted the game-winning goal for Team USA in their pre-tournament win over Czechia.

Cole Eiserman (Newburyport, Mass.) is the championship's leading goal scorer with eight markers in the opening four games, the most by an American underager in tournament history. Eiserman is up to 68 goals and 102 total points for 2022-23, and within distance of Cole Caufield's single-season NTDP record of 72 in 2018-19.

SERIES HISTORY

Team USA is quite familiar with Czechia at the U18 World Championship as this will mark the 20th career meeting between the two teams.

The U.S. holds a 15-2-1-1 record this far, having won 17 straight after losing the first pair of matchups in the all-time schedule in 2001 and 2002.

Team USA played Czechia twice in last year's event, 6-2 (preliminary) and 6-1 (semifinals) finals, although the Czechs led both games 1-0 after 20 minutes.

Additionally, Czechia was Team USA's lone pre-tournament opponent coming into IIHF play, a 9-2 win for the U.S. in Porrentruy. Adam Dybal was in net for the Czechs, but he did not see any action in the preliminary round.

A GAME OF QUARTERS

The U.S. enters today's game with a 12-0-1-1 record in quarterfinal play at the IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship. Most recently, the U.S. topped Latvia, 13-3, in last year's championship as **Ryan Leonard** (Amherst, Mass.) was named U.S. player of the game after a hat-trick performance.

The last time Team USA and Czechia met in a quarterfinal game was on April 21, 2016, an 8-0 win for the U.S. behind three points from Clayton Keller and a 15-save shutout for netminder Jake Oettinger.

FINISHING STRONG

Team USA has the tournament's best goal differential with a +31 margin through four games, and their +12 margin in the third period is the top mark among any team.

SPECIAL SPECIALS

After the opening preliminary-round games at the IIHF U18 World Championship, Team USA sits atop both ends of team special teams rankings, sitting in first place in power-play (52.9%) and penalty kill (93.3%).

Cole Eiserman (Newburyport, Mass.) leads the way with four scores on the man advantage, **Ryan Leonard** (Amherst, Mass.) has added a pair and **Will Smith** (Lexington, Mass.), **Carey Terrance** (Akwesasne, N.Y.) and **Oliver Moore** (Mounds View, Minn.) have each found the back of the net.

The penalty kill has only surrendered one power-play goal, and its 93.3 % conversion rate is nearly 12 percent better than Sweden, who ranks second. **Carter Slaggert** (South Bend, Ind.) has netted the team's lone shorthanded score in the tournament, although Leonard led the team during the NTDP season with three.

PRE-TOURNAMENT VS. CZECHIA

Gabe Perreault (Hinsdale, Ill.) had two goals and two assists and **Will Smith** (Lexington, Mass.), **Cole Hutson** (Barrington, Ill.) and **Carey Terrance** (Akwesasne, N.Y.) added three points apiece as the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team skated past Czechia, 9-2, in their lone pre-tournament game ahead of the 2023 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship.

NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING

Seventeen members of the 2023 U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team were named to the National Hockey League Central Scouting's Final Rankings ahead of the 2023 NHL Draft, set to take place June 28-29 at Bridgestone Arena in Nashville, Tennessee.

Will Smith (Lexington, Mass.) was the highest-rated Team USA player and maintained his third overall ranking from the mid-season report in January. **Ryan Leonard** (Amherst, Mass.) sits in the fifth overall spot for North American skaters, while **Oliver Moore** (Mounds View, Minn.) is eighth overall and **Gabe Perreault** (Hinsdale, Ill.) rounds out the top-10 in the 10th slot.

Forward **Danny Nelson** (Maple Grove, Minn.) ranks in the top-32, indicating a possible first-round selection in the draft, at 22nd overall. **Carey Terrance** (Akwesasne, N.Y.) followed at 38th overall, up 12 spots from the mid-term list.

A trio of defenseman appear next on the final rankings, as **Paul Fischer** (River Forest, Ill.) sits at 58th, followed by **Drew Fortescue** (Pearl River, N.Y.) right behind at 60th and **Brady Cleveland** (Wausau, Wis.) in the 64th slot.

Beckett Hendrickson (Minnetonka, Minn.) climbed up the rankings significantly to 67th overall after he sat 94th in January's mid-term rankings. Following Hendrickson is **Aram Minnetian** (Woodcliff Lake, N.J.) at 78th and **Zach Schulz** (South Lyon, Mich.) at 96th.

Team USA continued its representation with **Will Vote** (Arlington, Mass.) at 145th, **Salvatore Guzzo** (Old Tappan, N.J.) at 196th and **Ryan Fine** (Center Moriches, N.Y.) rounding out the skaters at 200.

In the cage, a pair of U.S. goaltenders were ranked highly among North American netminders as **Trey Augustine** (South Lyon, Mich.) finished at third and **Carsen Musser** (Sherburn, Minn.) sits eighth in the final Central Scouting listing.
