TONIGHT'S GAME

The U.S. Men's National Team takes on Canada here tonight with the 4 Nations Face-Off championship on the line. The puck is slated to drop at 8:20 p.m. ET and the game can be seen live in the U.S. on ESPN.

The U.S. and Canada have played 15 times in Canada Cups/ World Cup of Hockey/4 Nations Face-Off events, with Canada having a 10-4-1 (W-L-T) advantage.

The U.S. and Canada take the ice as foes for the second time at the 4 Nations Face-Off. Team USA claimed a 3-1 victory in the contest as **Jake Guentzel** scored twice and **Dylan Larkin** tallied the game-winner. U.S. netminder **Connor Hellebuyck** stopped 25 of 26 shots in the victory.

US & CANADA: FOR ALL THE MARBLES

Team USA and Canada have faced off in the final round of NHL-sanctioned international tournaments twice before. Canada claimed the first two games of a best-of-three championship round at the 1991 Canada Cup, while the U.S. claimed the 1996 World Cup of Hockey, winning another best-of-three series, 2-1.

FAMILY BUSINESS & BOSTON PIZZA

Matthew and Brady Tkachuk look to join their father, **Keith**, as champions in NHL-sanctioned international best-on-best tournaments. Keith recored six points (5g, 1a) in seven games en route to the 1996 World Cup of Hockey championship ... At lunchtime Tuesday (Feb. 18), **Brady and Matthew Tkachuk**, with their parents **Keith and Chantal**, journeyed to Santarpio's Pizza in East Boston to shoot a segment for ESPN that will air in advance of tonight's game. The four sat at the bar and were guided through a fun conversation with ESPN producers while enjoying lunch. Santarpio's is an old staple for the Tkachuk family, particularly Keith, who shared it was a place he has been to more than 50 times, including growing up as a kid.

A CALL FROM THE PRESIDENT

U.S. president **Donald Trump** called Team USA before its pre-game skate this morning to wish them good luck in advance of tonight's game. The call came in at 9:45 a.m. to U.S. general manager Bill Guerin, who walked into the team's dressing room and put his phone on speakerphone in the center of the room. The President spoke to the team for approximately five minutes with Guerin providing some remarks in response.

U.S. NATIONAL SLED TEAM

The U.S. National Sled Team arrived in Boston Sunday (Feb. 16) to get ready for games against Canada yesterday (Feb. 19) and today (Feb. 20) in Saugus, Mass. Team USA won the opening contest, 4-3, with Declan Farmer scoring the game-winner, which was his 200th career goal. The two contests are being staged by the NHL -- in cooperation with USA Hockey and Hockey Canada -- as part of the festivities around 4 Nations Face-Off. Both the U.S. and Canadian teams will be a tonight's 4 Nations Face-Off championship game.

LEADERSHIP

Auston Matthews is the captain of Team USA. He serves as the captain of the NHL's Toronto Maple Leafs. Serving as alternate captains of Team USA are **Matthew Tkachuk** of the Florida Panthers and **Charlie McAvoy** of the Boston Bruins. Matthews, Tkachuk and McAvoy have played together twice on the international stage for Team USA, helping the U.S. earn gold at the 2015 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship and bronze at the 2016 IIHF World Junior Championship. In addition, Matthews was also part of the gold medal-winning U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team at the 2014 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship and played for Team USA at the 2015 IIHF World Junior Championship and 2016 IIHF Men's World Championship.

WERENSKI FILLS THE STAT SHEET

U.S. defenseman **Zach Werenski** leads all skaters at the 4 Nations Face-Off in assists (5) and is tied for the tournament lead in points heading into tonight's championship game. The Blue Jackets stand-out recorded three helpers in Team USA's win over Finland and tallied an assist in contests against Canada and Sweden.

TIDBITS

The U.S. had Tuesday (Feb. 19) off and practiced at TD Garden yesterday. Team USA also had an optional morning skate earlier today ... As the top seed heading into the championship game, Team USA has the Boston Bruins locker room and will be the home team tonight.

INSPIRING PRESENCE/WORDS

The U.S. last won a major senior-level men's tournament in 1996, that being the championship of the 1996 World Cup of Hockey. And prior to that it was the gold-medal performance of the 1980 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team. At a team dinner on Feb. 10, the players and staff had the pleasure of the company of captain **Mike Eruzione** and forward **Rob McClanahan** from the 1980 team and also **Mike Modano**, the top American-born point producer and goal scorer in NHL history and also a member of Team USA for the 1996 World Cup of Hockey. In addition, **Guy Gaudreau**, father of Johnny and Matthew Gaudreau was an inspirational part of the team dinner. Gaudreau also skated with Team USA on Tuesday (Feb. 11) and was part of the team photo.

BROCK NELSON'S GOLDEN FAMILY

Brock Nelson's uncle Dave Christian was a member of the 1980 "Miracle On Ice" Olympic Hockey Team. In addition, his grandfather, Bill Christian and great uncle, Roger Christian, were both on the 1960 gold medal-winning U.S. Olympic Team and another great uncle, Gordon Christian, played for the U.S. at the 1956 Olympic Winter Games where the team won the silver medal. Brock's middle name is ... you guessed it ... Christian.

THE CONNECTIVITY OF THE COACHING STAFF

Between head coach **Mike Sullivan** and assistant coaches **John Tortorella**, **John Hynes** and **David Quinn**, the four have been on the coaching staff of 30 different U.S. teams on the international stage. Three of the four were part of the 2016 World Cup of Hockey staff, including Tortorella (head coach), Hynes (assistant coach) and Sullivan (assistant coach).

HONORING GAUDREAU

All U.S. national teams -- men, women and sled -- are wearing a helmet sticker to honor the memory of Johnny and Matthew Gaudreau throughout the 2024-25 season. At the 4 Nations Face-Off, a jersey celebrating Johnny, who played for the U.S. on the international stage on multiple occasions, hangs in Team USA's lockerroom and the jersey is presented in the U.S. lockerroom to the player of the game after victories. Guy Gaudreau, father of Johnny and Matthew, was with Team USA on Feb. 10 and 11.

NATIONAL TEAM DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

A total of 15 players who have been part of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program are among the 23 players on Team USA. The group includes **Matt Boldy** (2017-19), **Jack Eichel** (2012-14), **Brock Faber** (2018-20), **Adam Fox** (2014-16), **Noah Hanifin** (2013-14), **Jack Hughes** (2017-19), **Dylan Larkin** (2012-14), **Auston Matthews** (2013-15), **Charlie McAvoy** (2013-15), **J.T. Miller** (2009-11), **Jake Oettinger** (2014-16), **Jake Sanderson** (2018-20), **Brady Tkachuk** (2013-15), **Matthew Tkachuk** (2013-15), and **Zach Werenski** (2013-14). In addition, U.S. coaches **John Hynes** and **David Quinn** also served as coaches at the NTDP.

FROM PREVIOUS EDITIONS OF 4 NATIONS GAME NOTES

Team USA includes 16 players who were first round NHL draft picks, including #1 overall choices **Auston Matthews** and **Jack Hughes** ... **Jack Eichel** (19-50--69) and **Kyle Connor** (30-39--69) each have 69 points in the NHL to lead Team USA, while **Zach Werenski** is third with 59 (17-42--59) ... **Kyle Connor** has 30 goals this season in the NHL, tops on Team USA. **Jack Eichel** is second with 27 ... **Jake Sanderson** and **Brady Tkachuk** are the only two players part of Team USA without NHL playoff experience ... The U.S. is hosting three world championships over the next 12 months, including the IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship, April 23-May 3 in Frisco and Allen, Texas; the IPC Para Sled Hockey World Championship May 24-31 in Buffalo, N.Y.; and the 2026 IIHF World Junior Hockey Championship Dec. 26-29, 2025 - Jan. 5, 2026, in Saint Paul and Minneapolis, Minnesota ... U.S. assistant coach **John Hynes** celebrated his 50th birthday on Monday (Feb. 10) ... Brothers **Matthew and Brady Tkachuk** are playing together for the first time ever on a team.

MAKE A WISH

Team USA helped welcome Cameron Ward from Make-A-Wish, a 15-year-old from New Brunswick with cystic fibrosis. During its morning skate on Thursday (Feb. 13), Ward met a few players after practice and before the game he met with Team USA's coaches and then delivered the starting lineup in the lockerroom prior to Team USA's game against Finland.
