QUICK SHOTS

LEAGUE HISTORY: In 2019, Reno tied FC Cincinnati for the most regular-season wins in a club's first three seasons with 51. Reno and Cincinnati are the only clubs to win 50 matches through three seasons, and Reno did so with a +75 goal differential to Cincinnati's +50. Reno is also one of just six teams to make the playoffs in each of their first three seasons. Only FCC, Reno, Louisville City, Swope Park Rangers, New York Red Bulls II and Sacramento Republic FC accomplished the feat.

HE'S BACK! Forward Corey Hertzog returns to Reno for year two with the club after a record-breaking year one for the veteran. Hertzog finished the year with 19 goals, breaking Dane Kelly's club record of 18 set in 2017. The total broke Hertzog's previous career high of 14, set in 2017. The attacker's six assists also represented a career best.

OLD FRIENDS: Head coaches Ian Russell and Landon Donovan played together both in San Jose with the Earthquakes and with LA Galaxy. The duo won two MLS Cups with the Quakes in 2001 and 2003. Donovan went on to have possibly the most successful USMNT career ever, leading the national team in all-time goals (57) and assists (58) while appearing in three FIFA World Cups.

FAMILIAR FACES: San Diego's 2020 lineup includes two former 1868 FC players in midfielder Raul Mendiola and defender Emrah Klimenta. Last season, Mendiola led the club with eight assists on the season.

FIRST LOOK: The friendly with San Diego will serve as Reno fans' first look at the 2020 squad. Reno's previous four friendlies this preseason have all been closed to the public. This will also be the first of two matchups with San Diego, as Reno will face the Western Conference foe in Reno again on Sept. 29, and in southern California on June 27.

FOUR YEAR MEN: Reno's 2020 squad includes two players from the club's inaugural 2017 season, defenders Brent Richards and Thomas Janjigian. Richards owns club records in starts (87) and caps (89). Janjigian is 10th all-time in starts with 40. Through the club's first four seasons, the boys in blue have played 104 games (including playoffs) and Richards has missed just five. Additionally, Richards 13 assists are tied for fourth all-time, and tops among active 1868 FC players.

ASSISTANT COACH CHRIS MALENAB

On returners from last season

"It's great to have guys that know the culture and can defend the culture that Ian's built over the last few seasons. Bringing in some young guys and new faces is always good, it changes the outlook of what we're trying to accomplish, how we're trying to accomplish it and who we're trying to accomplish it with.

On getting off to the right start

"Obviously speed and athleticism is key to the American game. The more speed and athleticism you can add to your roster, along with soccer IQ, that's the edge. You look for not just tactical superiority but positional and individual superiority. If you have 11 guys that are faster, smarter, stronger than their 11 you're going to find success.

DEFENDER BRENT RICHARDS

On starting year four with 1868 FC

"It's been a blast the last three years. I keep coming back because it's been so fun and we keep having good teams. I'm excited to get going on year four and hopefully we have another good season."

On where the team's at

"We're feeling good. All of preseason has been guys feeling each other out and getting used to playing with each other. We've gotten a lot better defensively and we're starting to work on getting better offensively. We're excited to see how this next game goes and then I think we'll be ready for the start of the season."

FORWARD COREY HERTZOG

On how the club looks compared to last season

"I think we've got a little more speed. I'm too old to be speedy so they need to get people around me. We got a lot of speed and a lot of character on the ball. It should excite the fans and make the attack look good."

On getting off to the right start

"As a goal scorer you just want to get that first one, and once you do it's like a monkey off your back. Last season it took a while, eight or nine, but I'm coming into this year confident and hopefully can bang one in on Saturday."

LAST MATCH RECAP

RENO FALLS 3-1 TO SACRAMENTO REPUBLIC FC SEASON ENDS AFTER BEST REGULAR SEASON IN CLUB HISTORY

RENO, Nev. – Reno 1868 FC's 2019 season came to a close tonight, with the boys in blue falling 3-1 to Sacramento Republic FC in the USL's Western Conference quarterfinals. Reno's lone goal came from forward Corey Hertzog.

Los Azules scored first, with Hertzog capitalizing off of a poor pass back to the keeper in the fifth minute.

Sacramento would respond with a goal in the ninth minute goal, and despite Reno controlling possession 64% to 36%, the half would end tied 1-1.

The second half would be all Sacramento, with Republic FC adding two late goals in the 70th and 75th minutes to make the final score 3-1.

Matt Bersano started in goal, joining defender Brent Richards as the only players to start each of Reno's play-off matches in club history.

Despite bowing out of the playoffs, 2019 marked the best regular season in club history. 1868 set club records in points and wins, and finished the regular season higher than either of Reno's previous two seasons.

IAN RUSSELL - HEAD COACH - FOURTH SEASON

Reno 1868 FC head coach Ian Russell returns to Reno for his fourth season at the helm after a record-breaking 2019 to cap the best three-year start in USL history. Russell has been a finalist for USL Coach of the Year twice, and owns 52 wins with Reno. In 2019, Russell guided Reno to 18 wins and 60 points, both club records. Reno's September 20th win in New Mexico not only clinched the club's third straight trip to the playoffs, only five other clubs have made playoffs in each of their first three seasons, it was Russell's 50th win. Russell began his coaching career in 2008 with the Earthquakes as an assistant coach, a position he held for eight seasons. He helped lead the club to the postseason twice, while earning the Supporters' Shield for best regular season record (19-6-9) in 2012. Russell was also instrumental in the Quakes' international and collegiate scouting efforts, and briefly helped oversee the club's youth development as the academy's technical director. He served as the Earthquakes interim head coach for the final two games of the 2014 season and holds a U.S. Soccer Federation "A" coaching license. Russell played for the University of Washington before starting his professional career with the Seattle Sounders of the USL First Division in 1998 and 1999. Russell was drafted by the San Jose Earthquakes in 2000 and continued to play seven seasons in MLS. Six of those seasons came with the Earthquakes, where Russell helped the team win two MLS Cups in 2001 and 2003.



CASEY TATE - ASSISTANT COACH - FOURTH SEASON

Assistant Coach Casey Tate returns for his fourth season of coaching Reno 1868 FC, having been on Ian Russell's staff since the club's inception in 2017. Through his first three seasons with Reno 1868 FC, Tate has been a part of 51 regular season wins. The regular season win total tied FC Cincinnati's USL record for the most wins through a club's first three seasons. Before joining 1868, Tate spent eight seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Nevada. In 2016, Tate served as interim co-head coach with current Wolf Pack head coach Erin Otagaki. Prior to Nevada, Tate served as the girls' soccer coach at Seton Catholic Preparatory High School in Arizona where he led the school to back-to-back state titles in 2006 and 2007. Both years, Tate earned National Soccer Coaches Association of America Coach of the year honors. In 2007 and 2008, Tate was named Arizona state coach of the year, and regional coach of the year in 2007, 2008 and 2010. Tate played collegiately at Chandler-Gilbert, Indiana Institute of Technology, and Arizona State University. He received his degree from Ottawa University in History, and holds his US Soccer Federation Class A coaching license.



CHRIS MALENAB - ASSISTANT COACH - THIRD SEASON

Coach Chris Malenab returns to Reno for his third season of assistant coaching the club. Since joining Reno 1868 FC, Malenab has been a part of 34 regular season wins as well as the club's first playoff win over Real Monarchs SLC in 2018. He joined Reno 1868 FC in 2018 after spending the previous four seasons as an assistant at Sacramento Republic FC. During the 2014 inaugural season of Sacramento Republic FC, he served as an assistant coach to Predrag Radosavljević (Preki) during the club's championship campaign. From 2015 to 2017, Malenab added video analyst to his duties as an assistant coach for Sacramento under head coach Paul Buckle. Malenab currently holds various coaching certificates and licenses, including a USSF A-Senior License and the NSCAA (now United Soccer Coaches) Director of Coaching Diploma. Malenab received his bachelor's degree in sociology from California State University, Sacramento and has completed course work in two masters programs; Cross Cultural Education and Performance Psychology.
